Paul Bailey brought longtime resident and retired Forest Service employee, Buck Silva.

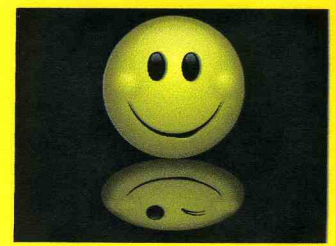
Buck shared his recent experience as a contracted emergency Incident Command System organizer working with British Petroleum and the United States Coast Guard on the recent Gulf of Mexico oil spill.

Buck was asked to go to Florida, around the 50,000 populated Panama City area to help in the BP oil spill disaster. Buck's experience in running incident command systems and getting workers and their equipment organized was badly needed and with their ongoing efforts really helped move forward the clean up efforts on our gulf coast.

While the upper levels of management were run by people familiar with the ICS system, the ground workers, made up of mostly contracted companies that have never used ICS systems, was stuck spinning their wheels and it took some effort to bring in the experts who have worked major forest fires, 9/11 terrorist attack and other big events like the "Rainbow Gatherings", to bring all the players together and to support the efforts and plans put in

Place. Buck's area hired all the ships it could that and any ship that was affected by the disaster was hired, so when news reports tell the story of fisherman losing money, it is very inaccurate.

While the fisherman might be losing the money they generated from fish, they made up for it as contracted cleanup and surveillance work. Clean up crews in the Florida area were mainly concerned with protecting the local ecosystem and the removal of tar balls, while the Louisiana area was working more on the oil slick. The tar balls ranged in size from BB's to grapefruits. On an average, the crews collected 100lbs per day. Once the well was capped and the leak stopped the collection dropped to around 6lbs a day and no signs of other oil in the water. 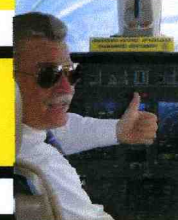

Meeting is replaced by an joint evening meeting with the Noon Club of Alturas and the Surprise Valley Rotary.

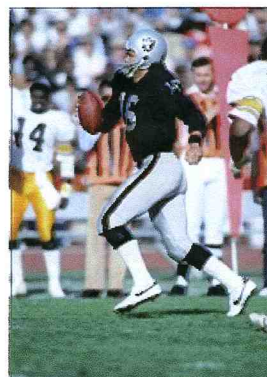
